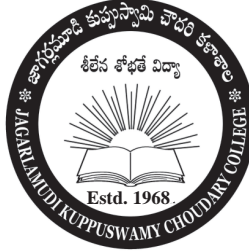

## Origin and History of the College

**Origin :** The Nagarjuna Education Society was formed in 1967 by eminent educationists, philanthropists and elders who realized the need for another college especially for rural youth and youth of the city in Guntur, as the existing colleges in the city could not cope with the growing demand for higher education.

Actuated by a sense of moral responsibility towards the younger generation, the Nagarjuna Education Society decided to start a college named after the celebrated philanthropist and patron of learning, Sri Jagarlamudi Kuppaswamy Choudary.

The college was inaugurated on 19-7-1968 by the late Buddhiraju Ramachandra Rao, M.A.,L.T. a veteran educationist and the first Principal of the Hindu College, Guntur under presidentship of Prof. K. Satchidananda Murthy, M.A., Ph.D. Former Vice-Chancellor, Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupathi. It is the ardent desire of Nagarjuna Education Society that this college shall establish an individual distinction by kindling the spark of idealism.

The inspiring name of Acharya Nagarjuna whose ancient university attracted seekers from different parts of the world and the hallowed memory of the late Jagarlamudi Kuppaswamy Choudary who rendered signal service in the spread of education in the district indicate the direction in which the college desires to progress.

**History :** The members of the College Governing Body are enlightened citizens and educationists. Founder President Sri Jagarlamudi Chandramouli, B.A., B.L, Ex-M.P., Ex-M.L.A., Ex-Member of the Syndicate of Acharya Nagarjuna University was a venerable man of high integrity and catholicity of outlook and under his efficient presidentship, which lasted for about two decades, the college achieved all round progress and good reputation.

Dr. K. Sadasiva Rao, a reputed surgeon and educationist who later succeeded Sri J. Chandramouli, Sri Chebrolu Hanumaiah, Ex-M.L.C. and Ex-Minister of Marketing, Govt. of A.P. and Sri Y.K.S. Prakasa Rao, B.A., a great philanthropist and educationist were original patrons.

Dr. Kondabolu Basavapurnaiah, renowned physician and surgeon who succeeded Dr. K. Sadasiva Rao as Secretary and Correspondent and now as President has played a pivotal role in the phenomenal physical and academic growth of the institution, working in tandem with all the members of the Governing Body.

A broad-minded sports lover Sri J. Narendernath, son of founder President, Late Sri J. Chandramouli, succeeded Dr. K. Basavapunnaiah as Secretary and Correspondent. In his two and half decades tenure, the college has seen a phenomenal growth in terms of infrastructure and academic excellence. The college was accredited with A grade by NAAC and Autonomy status was conferred by UGC during the period of his able administration.

A broad-minded and disciplined philanthropist Sri Jagarlamudi Murali Mohan, B.Tech., M.B.A., son of founder President, Late Sri J. Chandramouli, is now the Secretary and Correspondent of the College. We firmly wish that under his guidance the college will reach new heights of glory in the years to come.

Though the college started with humble beginnings, it has steadily grown from strength to strength, acquiring a full-fledged status in a very short time. By achieving remarkable results in the academic sphere, JKC College has carved out a niche for itself in the temple of education in Andhra Pradesh.

## Academic Rules and Regulations

As an autonomous college, Jagarlamudi Kuppuswamy Choudary College has adopted the semester system. The academic year is divided into two semesters. Each semester consists of 90 instructional days. The odd semester is from June to October. Even Semester is from November to March. Each semester is a complete unit by itself. The instructional methods include conventional lectures, IT-based sessions, classroom interactions, guest lectures, seminars, symposia, field studies etc. The respective departments provide the syllabi and the model question papers to the students.

### Existing Rules

#### 1. Attendance

- 1.1 Attendance will be calculated in terms of percentage while awarding marks.
- 1.2 Minimum attendance required by a student to take semester - end examinations:
  - (i) Theory : 75 percent (ii) Practical: 90 percent
- 1.3 At least 60 percent attendance in the semester is required by a student to pay the condonation for shortage of attendance, on medical grounds on production of medical certificate from a registered Medical Practitioner.
- 1.4 If a student participates in Inter-collegiate or Inter-university, State or National-level tournaments / athletics / NCC / NSS the actual number of days (excluding Sundays and holidays), shall be added to his / her class attendance subject to a maximum of 20 days in a semester or 30 days in a year. Prior permission should be taken from the Principal of the College to participate in the above events. The list of participants in the above said events must be submitted by the concerned incharges to the concerned Departments and Controller of Examinations before the commencement of 2nd Mid-Test in each semester.
- 1.5 If a student is absent even for one period either in the morning or evening session, he / she will lose half day attendance.
- 1.6 A student should apply for leave whenever he / she is absent to college. The sanction of leave is at the discretion of the Principal, when the respective Head of the Department forwards the leave.



- 1.7 A student of the first semester should seek fresh admission in the event of detention or discontinuation. Any student of 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> semester who has shortage of attendance shall be required to repeat the semester in the next academic year.

## 2. Readmission

If any student is detained or discontinued in any semester, on readmission into the same semester in the subsequent year, he/ she is required to pass papers prescribed for new batch of students, for the award of degree. If any paper is introduced in the new curriculum he/she should get pass marks in them. However, exemption will be given to already completed papers in the earlier semesters.

## 3. Examination and Evaluation

The college follows evaluation system based on Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and Semester - End- Examination (SEE). All eligible students have to pay the prescribed fee for both theory as well as practical examinations. No student is allowed to take examination without payment of Examination fee.

### 3.1 : Theory

100 marks allotted for each theory paper in a semester/ seminars shall be distributed with 30:70 weightage between CIA and SEE (admitted before 2014-17 batch) and 25:75 weightage between CIA and SEE (admitted from 2015-18 batch onwards).

### 3.2 CIA

It consists of tests, assignments and regular attendance during the semester. 30/25 Marks allotted for CIA are distributed as follows.

Note : Average of two Mid Tests will be taken. If a student fails to take any one test, marks for that test will be considered as '0'. If he fails to take two tests he lose the marks allotted to the Mid Tests.

### 3.3 Mid-Tests

Each Mid Test is held approximately after 45 days of instruction. The respective departments will provide the schedule, syllabus and model question paper for the tests in consultation with the Controller of the Examinations.

Absence from a scheduled test will be viewed very seriously, unless permission is obtained from the Principal/HOD before the end of the scheduled examinations.

### 3.4 Supplementary Mid Test

Supplementary Mid Test will be conducted at the end of the semester in the entire syllabus, only to those students who are unable to attend both the tests due to health reasons and **candidates who failed in CIA**. They will be given permission only after paying the necessary fee. The Supplementary Mid Test will be conducted with duration of two hours during the supplementary SEE (Odd Semester in April, even semester in November)

### 3.5 Assignments/Seminars

Every student has to submit an assignment/Seminar in each subject during a semester. The lecturer concerned will decide the topic of the assignment/Seminar and time limit for its submission. **Assignments/Seminar are not accepted after the stipulated date. The students will lose marks for assignments/Seminar if they are not submitted within stipulated date.**

### 3.6 Attendance

Depending on the percentage of attendance, marks will be awarded as per the procedure shown below.

Percentage of Attendance	Marks
75 and above but less than 80	2
80 and above but less than 85	3
85 and above but less than 90	4
90 and above	5

### 3.7 Semester End Examinations

The academic year is divided into two semesters, the first from June to October, and the second from November to March. Each semester will have a minimum of 90 days of instruction. Semester

End Examinations will be conducted in papers of all semesters in October/November and March / April every year for all courses.

- 3.8. A candidate who fails in SEE of Part-1 or II may take the examination in the course in which he/she failed either in the supplementary examination conducted at the end of the next semester or along with the candidates of the sub-sequent batch at the regular Semester End Examinations as the case may be.
- 3.9 A student who fails to write SEE in the current semester due to valid reasons will be allowed to write those papers as arrears in the subsequent SEE on payment of Rs. 300/- for theory and Rs. 300/- for practicals. A student can avail this additional provision only once during the course.

#### **4. Practicals**

The practical work includes laboratory work, project work, fieldwork, practical training, record work, etc., throughout the year. 30 marks are allotted under CIA and 70 marks for year end practical examination. The respective departments will provide the syllabi, model question papers.

**4.1 CIA :** The Continuous Internal Assessment for practicals is based on the student's performance in the laboratory work, project work etc.,

**4.2** The year end practical examinations will be held during March/ April, once in a year. All eligible candidates shall take the examinations only during this period. Supplementary examinations will be conducted on yearly basis only. Students will be divided into batches for practical examinations. Each batch has to take the examinations on the specified date as per the schedule. Out of 70 marks, 10 marks are allotted for Record and 10 marks for viva-voce.

The students should have at least 90 percent of attendance in laboratory work during the year. Every student should submit a duly certified record at the time of practical examinations. If a student fails to submit the record at the time of Examination he/ she loses record marks.

#### **5. Malpractice**

- 5.1 Any unfair method in theory and practical examinations is considered seriously and stern action will be taken.
- 5.2 Malpractices Enquiry Committee consists of three Senior Lecturers who are nominated by the Board of Management. One

Lecturer acts as Chairman and the other two as members. The committee will take the procedure of the rules and regulations related to malpractice cases which will come into force with the approval of academic council. All malpractice cases will be decided based on these rules and the recommendations of the malpractices enquiry committee shall be approved by the Principal.

## **6. Regulations for Passing and Classification**

A candidate who secures at least 40% marks in the SEE and CIA independently shall be declared to have passed in that paper.

- 6.1 The classes shall be awarded for Part-I & Part-II separately on the basis of aggregate marks of all the prescribed courses in that part.
- 6.2 A Candidate to be eligible for the award of higher class/ division shall pass all courses of Part - 1 earlier to or along with the IV Semester End Examination, passing IV semester courses of Part-1 in one attempt and all courses of Part- II earlier to or along with the VI Semester End Examination, passing VI semester courses in one attempt.
- 6.3 The candidate is required to pass all papers of the three-year programme within 3 years from the date of admission into the programme to be eligible for the award of higher class i.e., First or Second class in Part-I and Part-II. After the prescribed period of 3 years from the date of admission into the programme, the candidate will be awarded only Third Class irrespective of the marks scored in Part-I or Part - II.
- 6.4 In order to be eligible for a Rank, Award, Gold Medal, Distinction, Prizes and Similar commendation, a candidate must have appeared and passed all the papers in the respective Semester End Examinations only.

## **7. Result and Memorandum of Marks**

Semester results will be announced within a period of 30 days after completion of examinations.

When the semester-wise marks memoranda are ready, they will be issued to all the eligible students.

- 7.1 At the end of the course cumulative marks statements/ transcript are issued to the successful candidates on request after paying the prescribed fee.

- 7.2 No duplicate transcript will be issued without a substantive reason shown by the student. After a through enquiry and following the rules established by the college, the transcript will be issued by collecting the prescribed fee.

## 8. Appeals

- 8.1 CIA Valuation : Any student who has grievance about the Mid Test or Assignment shall bring it to the notice of the lecturer concerned within 24 hours after receiving the answer script. If the student is not satisfied, he/she may make an appeal to the Principal in writing. The Principal is authorized to settle the matter by referring it to grievances committee.

- 8.2 CIA Rectification : Any rectification with regard to the tabulation of CIA marks shall be brought to the notice of the Controller of the Examinations. **The Students must preserve Mid Test Answer scripts and Assignment papers of each semester until the marks statements are issued.**

### 8.3 Semester End Examinations :

Representations for retotalling/revaluation regarding SEE shall be submitted in the prescribed proforma along with prescribed fee receipt.

- 8.3.1 Retotalling : A student may apply for retotalling of marks in any paper within 10 days from the date of announcement of Marks / declaration of results by paying prescribed retotalling fees.

- 8.3.2 Revaluation : A student may apply for revaluation in any paper within 10 days from the date of announcement of marks/ declaration of results by paying prescribed revaluation fees.

### 9. Betterment / Improvement :

A candidate who completes his/her degree i.e., who passes all semesters in 3 years is eligible to appear at the immediate succeeding SEE for improvement in any/all papers by paying the prescribed fee. Marks are compared to the previous marks and higher mark of the two will be considered as the final mark.

10. **Instant Examination** : A candidate who has passed all the papers in all the semesters except one Theory paper of VI semester may take instant examination conducted soon after the declaration of results of VI semesters. However, there is no provision for revaluation of answer scripts of Instant Examinations.

### 11. **Change of Syllabus / Course :**

When the syllabus in a course is revised, only three chances in succession shall be allowed in that course with Pre-revised syllabus. Candidates, who do not pass in these three chances in succession, will have to take the new course with the revised syllabus/course for their subsequent attempts.

### **Choice Based Credit System (From 2013-16 Batch to 2014-17 Batch)**

Choice based credit system coupled with grading is an innovative method of curriculum design and evaluation. This is a modern system introduced in institutions of Higher Education. Students are offered with a choice of a variety of core subjects, Add on courses, supporting courses, Elective courses and courses improving soft-skills. They can choose any course of their interest and need during the period of their study. They can acquire extra credits and certificates, in addition to the regular compulsory subjects (core). Jagarlamudi Kuppuswamy Choudary College has adopted CBCS under semester system from the academic year 2013-14 onwards. In this system, every subject to fixed with certain credit points, based on the quantum of the subject matter, complexity of the pattern and the contact hours allotted. This is done after thorough analysis of the content and sequence of each course by the members of the Board of Studies.

The programme committee shall fix the credits for each part and subject depending upon its weightage in curriculum.

Students can acquire extra credits by rendering community service during vacation through Govt. Organisations/NGOS/ Registered Trusts etc. The candidates shall be assessed by a panel nominated by the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates should register their names with the Controller of Examinations before opting this.

Internal Assessment for self-study courses and courses chosen for acquiring extra credits will be made through periodical tests. Marks are not allotted for attendance. Semester End examinations shall be external. A student shall choose two foundation courses and two inter disciplinary courses which are not related to core subjects and shall complete for the award of degree.

However, a student is permitted to take Add-on course/ Supporting course/Certificate Course. In such case, the performance and the credits acquired shall be transferred to Part-I (4) to meet the minimum requirement and also acquired additional credits. Further, a student completing a certificate course from a university/ deemed university/college recognized by the UGC / Chartered Accountants Institute of India/Cost and Works Accountants Institute of India will be exempted from Part-I-(4). Such students should take permission from the controller of examinations before registration. These courses are meant to enhance value of the core/improve core completely.

**Add-on/Supporting Courses**

1. Communicative English
2. Journalism
3. Tourism
4. Medical Lab Technology
5. Investment Management

Add-on/supporting courses will be conducted beyond the working hours of the college. The minimum number of students shall be 15 to conduct any of the courses.

## AWARD OF DEGREE :

A student shall be eligible for the award of the Degree only when he/she has successfully completed a programme, of not less than the three years duration (6 Semesters) and secure the minimum number of credits prescribed given below, within a period of six years.

1. A student should acquire a minimum of 126 credits by passing the course prescribed under Part I and Part-II of an undergraduate programme to become eligible for the award of degree.
2. A student shall acquire a minimum of one credit by participating in the extracurricular activities listed under Part-III.
3. A Student shall acquire a minimum of one credit by passing the courses listed under Part-IV
4. Class and overall grade is awarded to Part-I and Part-II separately.
5. Part - I and Part-II of all courses shall have both internal and external evaluation. Internal evaluation is carried out through periodical tests, Assignments, Seminars and Attendance. A student can opt for either assignment or seminar.
6. Part III and Part-IV shall have internal evaluation. Grade are awarded.

### Award of Credits/Grades

1. The student will acquire/earn the assigned credits on passing completion of the course in Part-I and Part-II.
2. On completion of the programme, the performance of the students is indicated in terms of Overall Average Mark (OAM), Overall Weighted Average Mark, Letter grade and Number of credits acquired/earned.
  - a) Overall Average Mark (OAM) covering all semesters is given to the passed out student for Part-I and Part-II separately.  
OAM=Marks Secured / Miximum Marks.
  - b) Overall weighted average marks (OWAM) covering all semesters is given to the passed out candidate for Part-I and Part-II separately.

$$OWAM = \frac{\sum CM}{\sum C}$$

Where, C = Credit allotted to the candidates to the course and

M=Marks secured in the course



- c) Grades are also awarded to all the passed out candidates in Part-I and Part-II. Relative grading is given on a 5-point scale following the standard deviation method as follows.

One-Half of the standard deviation is added to the mean of Overall weighted Average Marks {OWAM} of all the passed out candidates to fix the upper limit and one-half of the standard deviation is subtracted from the mean to fix the lower limit. The upper and lower limits are the cut off points for B grade.

One standard deviation is added to upper cut off of B grade to fix A-O Grades

One standard deviation is subtracted from the lower cut off of B to find the cut off of C-D grades. However, the lower limit for D grade shall be taken at 40 marks.

**NB :** When the overall wighted average marks (OWAM) are skewed, the values i.e. one-third, one-fourth, one-fifth, one-sixth or three-fourths of the standard deviation, may be used instead of one-half.

O = 90% and Above; A = 75% to 89%; B = 60% to 74%;

C = 50% to 59%; D = 40% to 49%

3. In case of Part-III the following direct grading is awarded by the teacher concerned.

O = Out Standing; A = Very Good; B = Good; C = Average;  
D = Below Average.

4. In case of Part-IV the following absolute grading system on a 5 points scale is awarded.

O = Out Standing; A = Very Good; B = Good; C = Average;  
D = Below Average.

**Note :** The CBCS pattern followed upto the academic year 2014-15 is revised as per the guidelines issued by UGC and APSCHE. The new pattern is implemented from the batches admitted in the academic year 2015-16

## The Rules and Regulations of the College Library

### **Working hours of the Library :**

The Library and the reading room remains open from 8.30 am to 6.00 pm. On Sundays and public holidays it will remain open from 9.00 am to 1.00 pm.

### ***Membership conditions to borrow library books :***

Every student may get his/her library card on showing his/her ID card and college fees receipt at the library counter. The student should not transfer his/her library card to others. The student should show his borrower card on demand.

Every student may borrow one book at a time from the library and may keep it with him/her for a week. He/She should not give this book to others. He should not spoil the book by drawing the lines. When the student borrows the book from the library he/she should check whether the book is in good condition or not. If the book is damaged or spoiled the student will be held responsible. When a student returns the library books he/she is expected to see that the return of the books is recorded in his/her library card. Reference books, rare books and magazines will not be issued to home.

### ***Code of Conduct :***

The moment a student enters the library he/she should put his/her signature in the visitor's register.

Students have to maintain silence in the library and in the reading room.

Students should not cause any sort of damage to the library property and equipment. If any student causes any damage to the library property and equipment he/she shall pay proper compensation for it. If any student behaves contrary to the rules and regulations of the library, he/

she will lose his/her right to enter the library, he/ she cannot get any facility from the library.

The rules and regulations which are now in force may be changed or new rules may be framed without any prior notice to the students. The library committee is empowered to do so.

***If Borrower Card is lost :***

When a student loses his/her borrower card he/she should inform the librarian of the loss. If books have been borrowed by that time, the students who has lost the card will be held responsible for the borrowed books.

The student may get a duplicate borrower card with the librarian's permission and by paying Rs. 5/-.

***Renual of books and cancellation of borrowed books :***

Books which are not in demand and books which are not registered may be borrowed by the student twice by extending the due date for the return of the books.

The Librarian is empowered to get the books returned to the library by cancelling the borrowing of the books without showing any reason.

***Dues and fines :***

Books should be returned on or before the date mentioned on the borrower card. If the library books are not returned on or before the due date, fines will be levied. The borrower has to pay 50 paise per book per day after the due date. The fine amount should be paid in the Andhra Bank on the college campus and submit the receipt in the library.

If the due date is in holidays, the student has to return the book on the first working day after the holiday.

Even though the student does not attend his/her regular classes, he/she should return the library books on or before the due date.

***Payment of compensation for lost or damaged books :***

If the student causes any damage to the library property and equipment he/she should pay the compensation amount fixed by the librarian immediately.

If any student loses a library book he/she should submit a new book to the library. If a volume in a set of volumes is lost the borrower should pay for the cost of the whole set.

If a book is lost the price of which is less than Rs 20/- the borrower has to pay thrice the price of the book, and if the book is lost, the price of which is more than Rs 20/- the borrower should pay double the price of the book along with fine.

**No dues certificate :**

Students who want to appear for Public Examinations and who want to get their hall tickets should get no dues certificates from the librarian and submit them in the college office.

**Book - Bank**

This Book Bank is created to lend standard books to eligible poor students on a long term basis. This scheme is jointly maintained by the UGC of New Delhi and Management of our college. If any student wants to get benefit from this scheme he/she should get permission from the college librarian. Under this scheme, every student may borrow two books at a time and may use them for two weeks. The books that are borrowed in that manner should be returned to the library before the completion of Public Examinations. Students need not pay any amount for running this scheme.

**Book - Bank (for the SC and ST Students)**

This scheme was started in our college in the academic year 1982-83 with the financial assistance of the State Government specially for the welfare and benefit of the SC and ST students. After estimating the number of the SC and ST students in our college, all main text books are bought in triplicate to meet their needs. Under this scheme students may borrow books and use them till the end of the academic year. The SC and ST students need not pay any fee for maintaining this scheme.

**Note :** The rules and regulations of the college library mentioned here are not full and complete. Those who want to know the complete rules and regulations of our college library may consult the librarian.

## **Rules and Regulations Relating to Attendance, Progress and Discipline**

### ***I. Attendance :***

1. Students shall attend classes regularly and punctually.
2. Students shall not be absent without applying for leave.
3. Irregular attendance deprives the student of his right to be promoted to the next higher class or to be sent to the Board or Semester End Examinations.
4. Irregular attendance of the Students will be notified in the first week of October and in the third week of January in the college, and their parents / guardians will also be informed.
5. Irregular attendance or poor academic progress or absence from the Mid Examinations or indulging in any type of activity leading to indiscipline will disqualify students from any financial aid available in and through the college.

### ***II. Discipline and Conduct :***

1. It should be remembered that the College is a temple of learning and should be treated as such by all concerned.
2. **Cell phones are prohibited on the campus.**
3. Students are obliged to observe order and quiet at all times in the College.
4. Students are expected to help the College authorities in keeping classrooms and premises tidy.
5. Smoking and cycling on the campus are strictly prohibited.
6. If any student is found loitering on the campus without attending classes, he is liable to severe punishment.
7. Students are prohibited from organising any meeting or entertainment in the college or from collecting money for any purpose within the college without the prior permission of the Principal.
8. Students are expected to conduct themselves with the utmost decency and dignity. Any misbehaviour in the class room, on the campus and outside will lead to serious consequences.

### **III. Identity Card**

1. Students of First Year Inter, Degree and P.G. courses should get their I D cards at the time of their admission.
2. The I D card will be valid for a period of two years for Intermediate students, three years for Degree and M.C.A., students and two years for M.A. and M.Sc., students.
3. Students should wear I D cards while they are on the campus. Whenever the student has any work in the office or in the library, he/she must show his / her I D card. Unless I D cards are shown hall tickets, scholarships, certificates, true copies etc. will not be issued.
4. At the time of the College Anniversary Celebrations students will be allowed to enter the college campus on showing their I D cards. Students are required to come with their I D cards and participate in the college Anniversary programme and make it a success.
5. Old students of the college should bring their I D cards when they come for attestation and for other certificates.
6. Those who have lost their I D cards should get duplicate I D cards from the college office. The fee for the duplicate I D card is Rs. 50/-.

### **IV. Insurance to staff & students :**

The students, teaching and non-teaching staff are covered under personal accident insurance scheme.

**EXTRACTS FROM ANDHRA PRADESH  
ACT XXVI OF 1997  
PROHIBITING RAGGING IN EDUCATIONAL  
INSTITUTIONS**

**Prohibition of Ragging :**

Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.

**Penalty for Ragging :**

Whoever, with the intention of causing ragging or with the knowledge that he is likely by such act to cause ragging, commits or abets ragging and thereby -

- (i) teases or embarrasses or humiliates a student shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months or with fine which may extend to one thousand rupees or with both; or
- (ii) assaults or uses criminal force to or criminally intimidates a student shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year or with fine which may extend to two thousand rupees or with both; or
- (iii) wrongfully restrains or wrongfully confines or causes hurt to a student shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to five thousand rupees or with both; or
- (iv) causes grievous hurt to or kidnaps or abducts or rapes or commits unnatural offence with a student shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to five years and with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees; or
- (v) causes death or abets suicide shall be punished with imprisonment for life or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to ten years and with fine which may extend to fifty thousand rupees.

**Dismissal of students :**

- (1) A student convicted of an offence under section 4 and punished with imprisonment for a term shall be dismissed from the education institution.

- (2) A student convicted of an offence under Section 4 and punished with imprisonment for a term of more than six months shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

**Suspension of student :**

- (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the head or manager of an educational institution, such head or manager shall inquire into or cause an inquiry to be made into the same forthwith and if the complaint is prima facie found true, shall suspend the student or students complained against for such period as may be deemed necessary.
- (2) The decision of the head or manager of the educational institution under Sub-section (1) shall be final.

**Abetment :**

- (1) If the head or the manager of an educational institution fails or neglects to take action in the manner specified in sub-section (1) of section 6, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence and shall be punished with the punishment provided for the offence.
- (2) If a student commits suicide due to or in consequence of ragging, the person who commits such ragging shall be deemed to have abetted such suicide.

*Prohibition of Ragging in Educational institutions Act 26 of 1997*

**SALIENT FEATURES**

- Ragging within or outside any Educational institution is prohibited
- Ragging means doing an act which causes or is likely to cause insult or annoyance or fear or apprehension or threat or intimidation or outrage of modesty or injury to the student.



- Punishment for Different Types of Ragging:

<b>Nature of Ragging</b>	<b>Punishment</b>
1 Teasing, Embarrassing and humiliating	Imprisonment up to 6 months or fine up to Rs. 1.000/- or Both
2 Assaulting or using criminal force or criminal intimidation	Imprisonment up to 1 year Rs.2,000/ or both
3 Wrongfully restraining or confining or causing hurt	Imprisonment up to 2 years or fine up to Rs. 5,000/or both
4 Causing grievous hurt or abductig or rape or Committing unnatural offence	Imprisonment up to 5 years and fine up to Rs.10,000/-
5 Causing death or abetting suicide	Imprisonment up to 10 years and fine up fine Rs.50.000/-

**Note:-**

1. A student convicted of any of the above offences, will be expelled from the College.
2. A student imprisoned for more than six months for any of the above offences will not be admitted in any other college.
3. A student against whom there is prima facie evidence of ragging in any form will be suspended from the College immediately.
4. University level and college level anti-ragging committees / mentoring cells constituted for this purpose will look into complaints regarding Ragging, Eveteasing and sexual harassment.

## On the Evils of Eve-teasing

To cause any form of insult or harm to any creature without reason is not a human quality. It is an animal instinct, unnatural to a normal human being. One such evil is eve-teasing.

### **What is eve-teasing?**

It is causing any kind of physical or psychological harm to women and girls, when they are helpless to defend themselves, to derive a kind of sadistic delight.

Increasingly, this uncivilized behavior has become a social problem. It appears in many forms, both in direct and indirect forms. It is a symptom, of false heroism of persons with weak minds, improper domestic background and uncivilized affluence. In some cases, it is a pathological disorder of mind.

### **Who is causing this dangerous act?**

All are human beings, but some behave like beasts—they are eve teasers. Men of all ages of all social professional and domestic backgrounds are indulging in this. barbaric crime.

Woman must be respected and considered as a human being. Lack of this much of common sense is the root of this problem.

### **How to control this problem of eve-teasing in society?**

Strict Legal and Administrative measures are in place. They include legal provisions such as section IPC 294, 352, and 354.

Section 294 IPC stipulates that any person indulging himself in obscene songs and utterances in any place shall be punished with three months of imprisonment or with fine or both.

Section 352 IPC deals with punishing people, who use force or assault anybody, with imprisonment of three months or with a fine of Rs.500/-or both.

Section 354 IPC is more severe as it punishes a person indulging in outraging a woman's modesty, with an imprisonment up to 2 years or with fine or both.

Having said all these, this evil of eve teasing is the result of moral degradation and sadistic, bestial delight. Social sensitization, ex-communication and massive moral awareness may help, in the long run.

Hence, students are advised to behave like responsible citizens of India. They must behave like sensitive human beings. University will not spare their irresponsible behavior and take severe disciplinary action against these eve-teasers.

## **Payment of Fees**

### **College fees**
